Kodak No.2 Folding Autographic Brownie

The Kodak No.2 Folding Autographic Brownie was a folding camera for the type 120 Autographic film. More than half a million models were made between 1915 and 1926, with a various design tweaks made along the way. The sharp edged boxes were changed to curves in 1917 and the foot shape changed from an S shape to a C Curve in 1919.

In 1923 the lens used was Achromatic lens or Rapid Rectilinear. In 1925 a new type of lens was used, the Kodar f/7.9. In 1926 the UK made a model with Anastigmat f/6.3 lens

Film/frame size was Roll film (size 120), "Autographic" variant / 2¼×3¼". The camera had Kodex Ball Bearing Shutter with speeds B, T, 1/25 sec., and 1/50 sec. and Aperture settings "1", "2", "3", "4" (f/8, f/16, f/32, and f/64) The Viewfinder was a Reflecting type with a sliding focusing with lock.
